### **GUIDELINES FOR HORTICULTURE EXHIBITS:**

The prizes offered shall be open to all competitors subject to those regulations noted on the Prize schedule, and any exhibit not shown in conformity therewith will be ineligible for competition.

The Judge shall have the right of withholding any prize, when in their opinion, the exhibits are unworthy.

All prizes will be paid in full as printed in the schedule.

Second prizes will be awarded where there are more than three entries in any one class. Second prize to be half the first prize.

All exhibits for <u>Fern/Fern Allies & Foliage</u> competition must be the property of the exhibitor and have been in his or her possession for at least Six months before they are exhibited. With the exception of floral art entries specially excepted in this schedule. If it is proved that any exhibitor has infringed this provision, they shall forfeit any prize awarded in that class.

Cut Flowers becomes the property of the Innisfail & District Show Society following judging.

In every case, except aggregates and where otherwise stated, when entering for collections, it must be understood that the entries in other classes are not eligible.



### CUT FLOWERS

#### Judge : Mrs Gabrielle Crema

Artistic arrangements to be taken into account when being judged, but quality of the receptacle is not to be taken into account. Foliage natural to the blooms exhibited should not be removed.

#### Helpful Definitions:

*FLOWER or BLOOM:* One flower on a single stem with natural foliage, if any, no buds or laterals (as seen with roses and carnations) should be present.

*STEM or STALK:* Taken into account in exhibits where points are given for stems as in sweet peas, gerberas, lilies etc. Buds exhibiting colour on the stem will disqualify the exhibit. No laterals are allowed.

HEAD: Cluster or flowers forming a large flower, eg. Phlox hydrangea etc.

SPRAY: A stem with laterals and flowers attached, eg. Azaleas.

*SPIKE*: A straight main stem with flowers attached. No laterals are allowed, eg. Gladioli, Delphinium.

*CUT*: Laterals are allowed but not essential. Flowers may or may not be attached to one or more laterals, but all must be attached to one common stalk.

*LATERALS:* Side growths on a main stem allowable on cuts, sprays and in all decorative work. Laterals will definitely disqualify exhibits where single blooms, spikes or heads are required.
